## Biography

The couple married 28 July 1836 at St. Martins-in-the Field, England. At first the family lived at Fremantle but soon moved to Guildford where they bought a farm which they named 'Pyrton'. With no banks or businesses in the Colony, Edward invested his money by purchasing property and lending money for mortgages.

He soon owned a number of farms around the colony on which he employed working managers. He also owned the Belchers Mill in South Perth, Stanley Brewery and he was renowned for the horses which he bred.

Later the 'Bungalow' in Perth became their home and Edward bought land at Star Swamp and Mt Flora at North Beach where his beach home 'The Castle' was. Edward was a Member of the Executive Council and a Member of the Legislative Council between 1857 and 1865, a founding member on the Guildford Board of Education and was generous in many ways with church and the local community.

He financed JT Gregory's exploration to the north west where the range was named after him. He treated the aborigines with kindness. During this time he was a prominent and esteemed pioneer.

Anne Louise adapted to the informal and primitive conditions in the colony remarkably well. Because of her bearing she was often referred to as 'Lady Hamersley'. Her French accent caused their aboriginal servants to speak with a French accent.

Edward died 27 November 1874 at Perth and Anne died 22 September 1885 at Perth, Western Australia.

## Biography

Married Elizabeth just before leaving for the new Colony on 2 September 1829. Departed the Colony in November 1836 on the 'Joshua Carroll', with their two children and returned on the 'Britomart' 5 December 1838.

Elizabeth Hardey died at Grove Farm on the 14 April 1873 (aged 61 years). John Wall Hardey died 14 May 1885.

The paper the 'Inquirer' published this obituary 'as a settler, he was a thoroughly practical man, and bestowed much attention upon stockbreeding and viticulture. For several years Mr Hardey occupied a seat in the Legislative Council with much credit, while as a writer in the public journals, he displayed considerable power. He belonged to the Wesleyan Church, but for many years after arrival did not take any active part as a worker in that body, although he was a liberal supporter of the denomination, and at all times displayed a great interest in its Sunday Schools and foreign missions. In fact no good cause appealed to him in vain and he took a special interest in the welfare of the young. A few years ago, Mr Hardey was attacked by paralysis and was placed under the care of Mr and Mrs George Lazenby, whose assiduous attention assisted the patient in maintaining his serenity of disposition until the very last. His death occurred about eleven o'clock on Thursday night, and it is as though he expired while asleep. Mrs Hardey died several years before her husband, whose family is now represented by Mr RD Hardey, Mrs Waylen and Mrs Smythe.'

The Heal party consisted of Charles, Sarah and six children, Charles's brother William and sister Martha and her ward Jacob Stone and his sister Mary and her husband Abraham Morgan and 2 children. In the party was also Sarah's brother Thomas Millard and two servants Joseph Green and Benjamin Joyce. They were allotted two Guildford town sites (Lot 2 & 3) and built their first house in Market Street.

Within a few months Sarah lost her baby and four year old son. Further tragedy struck when Charles' sister Mary Morgan lost her husband just six month's after their arrival to the dreaded typhoid disease.

A year later Lieutenant Charles Heal died and was buried 3 April 1832 at Guildford, several months before his fourth son Robert was born. The two widows were left to struggle for survival and to raise their families. Sarah had only a background of 'Innkeeper' in Kilmerdon, Somerset, so thirteen year old son Charles had to take over location duties on his father's Guildford grant. This was 1123 acres, a narrow strip of land stretching from the Swan River westwards for seven miles.

Somehow Sarah and her son managed the mandatory 'location duties' and Sarah, being literate was strong enough to fight for her navy pension and her dead husband's land grants. She re-applied for the York grant of 1800 acres and her son Charles became a very successful farmer at 'Springdale', raising a family of 12 children. Sarah's daughters married well - Sarah to John Sydney Davis, a grazier of 'Tibradden Station'. Mercy married Arthur Shenton, editor of the Perth Gazette and Jane finally married Thomas Mellersh, a well to do banker's son.

Some years before he had jilted her and so became involved in the very first 'Breach of Promise' case in the new Colony. The youngest son Robert lived most of his life in Melbourne. Of his ten children there is not one descendant! Sarah died 15 December 1882 and is buried with her husband and two baby sons. A headstone to them can now be found behind the Guildford Grammar School Chapel.

He died suddenly on 28 February 1845 at 'Newleyine', Northam - sixteen years after arriving in the Colony. His legacy of hard work and astute business acumen resulted in his nephew Abraham William Morgan inheriting considerable rural and urban properties.

William had Perth Lots F14 and H17 approved in 1831. In the 1832 Census William is listed as a labourer in the service of Colonel Latour.

Some of the early settlers were sponsored by this man Latour to work on his establishment at Leschenault and were left in difficulties when Latour went bankrupt. They then had to use their initiatives. In 1833 a notice appeared in the Perth Gazette announcing that William and Sarah Higgins were operating a tavern called the 'Leyson Arms' at Bull Creek. They offered good hospitality for 'man and horse'. Bull Creek was becoming a river port for the settlers along the Canning River and adjacent areas. A jetty had been built and the water was deep enough to permit boats from Fremantle and Perth to tie up and deliver supplies. Unfortunately attacks by aborigines caused settlers to move away and trade dropped off.

Eventually the 'Leyson Arms' was burned down by aborigines in 1835. From Fremantle the family boarded the cutter 'Venus' for the Leschenault Inlet.

Around 1840 the Higgins family were among those eyeing good farming and forestry land along the Capel and Preston Rivers.

William died 11 November 1840 when he drowned in the Preston River. His wife Sarah and her seven children were determined to establish their own farms in the area. The Higgins brothers employed Ticket-of-Leave convicts to help drain their water-logged fields and do the heavy work around their property. Sarah died on 31 December 1867.

He built a hotel but on 17 December 1831 William drowned in the Swan River. Mary Ann Hokin remarried John Thomas 22 May 1833, who was convicted of plundering the wreckage of the ship 'Cumberland' in 1834. He was sent to Van Diemens Land for seven years. In 1837 Charles Hokin, aged 11 years old, was employed as a shepherd by Major Nairn and was wounded by a native spear. The aborigine was hanged. William and Mary Ann's daughter, Mary Ann, married Henry Strickland. Both she and her mother are buried in East Perth Cemeteries. Mary Ann Hokin (Thomas) died 3 August 1876. Three of the sons are interred in Maldon, Victoria and their graves have been restored by their descendants in 2004.

## Biography

William arrived with his brother James both nineteen years old and his friend Guy Maple as indentured servant labourers to Colonel Latour. On seeing the appalling conditions of the new colony their master left them on the beach to fend for themselves and departed for Van Diemens Land. They were left to live as best they could. William and James were anxious to work, but an employer who would pay cash was hard to find. Young and penniless and hopeful of better days they cut and hauled timber (sandalwood) for a living.

On the 4 January 1841 William (aged 30 years) married Martha Higgins who arrived on the 6 May 1830 on board the ship 'Britannia' with her parents William and Sarah Higgins. William and Sarah moved to Preston and then to Capel River in 1836. Later moving to Perth, then to Wonnerup and finally back to Capel. They settled on Lot 37 (45 acres) on the banks of the Capel River to farm and raise their large family of nine boys and three girls. Two other children had died at an early age, making a total of fourteen children. They faced many hardships raising such a large family.

William died 7 January 1875 and Martha died in 1902. Also refer the book 'Just a Horse Ride Away; A History of the Shire of Capel and its People'.

Bridget was sentenced to death on 3 October 1855 for her part in the murder of John Hurford. She was executed 15 October 1855. John Hurford had amassed property to the value of two thousand pounds. Preceding the murder, John had been to the Vasse and when he returned he said he was sore and not well. Bridget then went to Vasse and while there, asked what would happen to her if John died without leaving a will. Bridget conspired with William Enoch Dodd and Peter Dixon to forge a will in her favour. That night John died.
