Joseph Lacey signed on with Thomas Peel's Swan River Settlement Scheme and paid 60 pounds each for himself and his wife, and 30 pounds for each son. Had Fremantle Lot 68 in 1830. Conditions were so poor that Joseph and his family set off for Hobart, Van Diemens Land arriving on the 'Eliza' 2 May 1831. He bought a tavern in Hobart (Sandy Bay) where the family lived for some time.

Biography

Patrick drowned at Bunbury in the Vasse Estuary, September 1847. Bridget then married John Hurford of Vasse in 1851 (also of the 21st Regiment). Bridget was convicted of poisoning her husband (he died 8 April 1855 at Vasse). Bridget was later hanged for the murder of John Hurford on 15 October 1855 at Fremantle. She was the first woman to be executed in Western Australia and also the first execution in the 'new' Perth gaol. Bridget conspired with William Enoch Dodd and Peter Dixon to forge a will in her favour. They then killed Hurford. Bridget was sentenced to death 3 October 1855 for her part in the murder. John Hurford had been farming at Wonnerup and had amassed property to the value of two thousand pounds. Preceding the murder, John had been to the Vasse and when he returned he said he was sore and not well. Bridget then went to Vasse and while there, asked what would happen to her if John died without leaving a will. That night John died.

It is recorded that William Ledgard had expectations of a legacy of 1500 pounds under the will of his late father Daniel Ledgard of Mirfield. He is said to have left England without his parents. The family was known to Thomas Hardey and Charles Clarkson who came from Yorkshire in the Tranby. Ledgard accompanied Thomas Peel in the Rockingham and was listed as an apothecary having claimed to have studied as a surgeon. In 1831 he applied for the position of 'Keeper of Government Stock' at York. In 1832 he moved to Fremantle, the census showing him in the household of Charles Clarkson. He wrote several articles for the Gazette of native stories of a sighting of a figure taller than a house roof top in the wetlands along the Murray River on the holdings of Thomas Peel. In 1834 he held Fremantle Town Lot 131 and 132 in Short Street and 200 acres of land purchased from Thomas Peel adjoining Lake Munster adjacent to the town site of Clarence (Woodman's Point). He proposed marriage to the seventeen year old eldest daughter of John Bateman and in consideration made a marriage settlement of the lands in favour of John Bateman and Charles Clarkson. They were married 24 December 1834 at the Cantonment, Fremantle. The Perth Gazette 17 January 1835 reports of William Ledgard and five others being charged with stealing from the wreck of the 'Cumberland' which was taking the goods of the Bussell family to the Vasse. They all pleaded guilty and William was sentenced to seven years transportation to Van Diemens Land. Ledgard was granted his ticket-of-leave but Tasmanian records do not show his departure. A memorial deed 16 August 1878 (WA Vol 8/298) records that he died in South Australia at Butlers Creek about 9 May 1877. Wife remarried Robert Ferres 11 July 1848 at Fremantle. Elizabeth died 6 September 1898 in Kadina in South Australia.

Married Helen Mary (nee French) born c1817 (widow of George Chitty) at Buckland Northam 5 February 1852. Helen Mary arrived with her husband George Chitty on the ship 'Success' 22 March 1843. George Chitty worked at the Swan Settlement, then Toodyay and Northam before leasing Charles Pratt's property north-east of Northam. He leased Buckland for four years in partnership with Frederick Lee. Between them they had a major enterprise owning much stock. In January 1852 George fell while carrying a four bushel bag of wheat and suffered a ruptured and twisted bowel. He died in January 1852 leaving his wife Mary in a desperate situation with five children. She married Frederic Lee the same year at Toodyay. \When the lease on Buckland terminated Frederick Lee took his wife and stepchildren to Guildford to run a hotel. This was probably the original Rose and Crown. Unfortunately they did not stay long as the hotel burnt down. After the fire Frederick moved his family to Mortingup swamp block 137. He worked as a wagon driver on the Guildford to Toodyay run. After the youngest son was born the family moved to Jimperding and lived at Leatherhead. Helen died 8 February 1899 at Northam and Frederick Lee died 29 January 1906 at Toodyay.

William and Hannah married 23 May 1817, England. William introduced a fair capital into the colony and received from the Crown a Perth Town Lot at the corner of St George's Terrace and William Street.

He built and conducted the Freemasons Hotel, the site later occupied by the Palace Hotel and now the Bank West building. William also engaged in the business of general merchant and bought from the Government 450 acres of land in the vicinity of Mongers Lake, where he started 2 farms - Lake Farm and Dairy Farm.

William died at the early age of 47 years on 5 March 1845 at Perth, leaving his wife and eleven children. Hannah Emily died (aged 93 years) at Perth on 7 January 1889.

When Mongers Lake was subdivided it was named 'Leederville' in perpetuation of his name.

William, a 25 year old single man arrived as an indentured servant to Latour as a Blacksmith. He later became a Bricklayer and Grave-Digger. He was no. 361 on the December 1829 Muster Roll and No. 949 on the 1832 census. He married 27 August 1832 at Fremantle to Susannah Maydwell, the daughter of Robert and Susannah Maydwell. They had seven children. William is believed to have worked for John Gregory at 'Pineapple Inn' Guildford. Had Fremantle Lot 142 in 1831. On 26 October 1842 William gave a donation to the Church of England Church at Perth. William died in July 1869 and Susannah died in September 1893.

Paul Lockyer (Senior) was a millwright, who, soon after his arrival with his family from Somersetshire in 1830, built the first wind powered mill in the Colony. The mill, located in the vicinity of the Narrows in South Perth, still stands as one of the old landmarks of the early days. Paul had Fremantle Lot 305 in 1831. Paul and his wife Keziah separated in 1838 and Keziah and her daughter Eliza were moved to Fremantle by the Government and put into service, but Keziah found it difficult to work due to a physical disability. She later gained a reputation as a high class prostitute providing services to the army officers in the Colony. In 1838 Paul published a notice in the 'Perth Gazette' that he would not be responsible for his wife's debts as she was living with W.T. Graham. Keziah left the Colony in April 1839 per the 'Socrates' for Van Diemens Land. She only stayed there for a short time and then went to Melbourne. His son James was also a millwright and assisted his father with the construction of the Perth Mill and in 1841 began delivering mail between Guildford and York which he did weekly for six months. In 1855 he directed his brothers Thomas and Joseph with their construction of the Northam flour mill. Paul and his brother were both excellent horsemen and at one stage owned the 'South of Perth Racecourse'. The family entered pastoral pursuits in Roebourne area - hence Lockyer's Gorge is named - then retreated to farming in the Goomalling area when the railway line was laid in the early 1900's.

Another activity reported fully in the Perth Gazette and Western Australian Journal on 23 March 1833, was with a Mr Steele, of actively pursuing plans for him to manage a Whaling establishment at King George's Sound. In 1836 he returned to London on the 'River Plate' to obtain support for a suitable grant which was due to him but had not been forthcoming.

Whilst in London he married Jane Sarah Cruickshank 6 July 1837 (1817-1872). They returned on the ship 'Eleanor' in July 1837. They had twelve surviving children (five males and seven females). Lionel was granted land originally in the Murray district, but finally at Deepdale, Newcastle (Toodyay) Avon Loc. 3 of 4,784 acres. It was here as a Pastoralist and Farmer he established the property and raised his family. At some stage he employed fourteen ticket-of-leave men.

He became a JP and other endeavours during his lifetime included: 1841-47 Road Director, 1852 Superintendent of Toodyay Convict Establishment, and in 1854-1858 Superintendent of Mt Eliza Convict Establishment.

Lionel died 22 July 1863 at Toodyay and Jane Sarah died 29 June 1872.
