## Biography

William and Elizabeth Adams arrived in the Swan River Colony, as indentured servants to Thomas Peel. With them were their two young children, Caroline aged 2 years and John aged 6 months. Ten more children were born to William and Elizabeth between 1832 and 1849. By 1831, Elizabeth and William were one of a handful of families that had stayed with Thomas Peel and had accompanied him to his property on the Murray River.

In 1834, they were in the area during the 'Battle of Pinjarra' and signed a petition requesting more Police to be stationed at Pinjarra. In the 1836 Census, the Adams family were living on Garden Island but then moved to Fremantle and William worked as a Whaler and a Labourer. He had fought in the Battle of Waterloo where he was wounded in his head and as a result he had a silver plate inserted.

Elizabeth was referred to as 'The Mother of Fremantle' due to the amount of maternity cases attended by her in the early years. Everyone called her 'Granny Adams'. Elizabeth Adam's children married and produced large and well known families in Fremantle, such as the Hanham, Harwood, Chamberlain, Sheen, Hopkins, Davies, Brown, Hedland, Sweetman, Hall and Smith families. It was said, and written in a local newspaper of the time, that you couldn't throw a stone in Fremantle without hitting one of the Adams family.

William and Elizabeth Adams and four of their family are buried together and their grave is listed on the Heritage Trail of the Fremantle Cemetery.

## Biography

Married 3 June 1805 at Kirkaldy, Fife, Scotland. Alexander Anderson was the son of John Anderson, farmer in Dothan north of Chapel House, Abbotshall Parish, Kirkaldy, Fife, Scotland. His wife Cecilia was the daughter of Henry and Janet (nee Hutchison) Oliphant. Nine of their ten children arrived with them, son Henry having arrived Swan River c1830 and then to Van Diemens Land.

Also in the party was Thomas Anderson husband of Alex and Cecilia's daughter Janet (Jessie) who later married George Hardie in Victoria. Based on the goods and number of people they brought to the Colony, Alex and son-in-law Thomas were granted 6,900 acres at Mt Anderson, Toodyay (Newcastle), also 400 acres at Bassendean.

In 1835 and 1836 Alex and Thomas applied for an exchange of land on the other side of the Avon River. In 1836 Alex Senior and Thomas with Drummond and Whitfield explored a more direct route from Upper Swan to Newcastle via Woorilow Brook and Jimperding Hill, which was very rough and steep for horses, let alone carts. They followed the Avon River six miles to their grants which they looked over and defined their boundaries. A three day trip. As they were far from protection of the military at York and the few stock arriving at Swan River were being killed by dingoes and natives, no one settled on these grants at first, but they had to make improvements to gain their titles.

In 1836 Alex Senior went to Van Diemens Land to buy stock, taking daughters Jane and Cecilia. While there he joined George Russell on an expedition to Victoria. When he returned to Swan River in 1837 on the 'Eudora' with their sheep, he left Jane and Cecilia with his brothers John and Henry at Thorpe Mill, Bothwell, Van Diemens Land. John was a Master Mariner trading between Swan River and Port Phillip. Thomas and Jessie and three children arrived Hobart, May 1837, and a few months later Alex Senior and Cecilia and the rest of the family followed on the Abeona, joining the others at Thorpe Mill. Later to Port Phillip and Portland District.

Eventually many descendants came back to Western Australia. Alex Senior and Cecilia returned to Chapel House, Scotland in 1854, accompanied by son Henry and wife Julia and their Australian born children. Some of them returned to Australia later.

James Annice arrived in Derwent, Van Diemens Land aboard the 'Albion' on 4 May 1826 with Colonel Latour for the Cressy establishment, breeding horses for the Colony. James arrived in Albany in 1835, with William Diprose. Provided meat during shortages by kangaroo shooting. Married Petronella Stromberg (Swedish servant of G Cheyne). Petronella Stromberg arrived on the ship 'Sterling', they married 11 July 1839 at Albany and lived in a comfortable home on the York Hotel side of the present Town Hall. They had only been married 12 months when Petronella died in childbirth in 1841. The baby also died. James then married 23 November 1843 to - Ann Mooney who arrived on the ship 'Jane' with parents Lawrence and Elizabeth Mooney. Owned several farms and leases. He was also a carrier. He moved to a farm 'Coorinyup' - later 'Mayfield'. The farm remained in the family for over 100 years. James died 3 November 1884 and is buried at Kojonup.

### **Biography**

Married Margaret (nee Gow) 16 October 1810, Edinburgh, Scotland - she died 1824 London, England. She was born 15 May 1785, at Dunkeld, Perthshire, Scotland. Adam was employed by Thomas Peel as a Land Surveyor and Accountant to set up a settlement for emigrants at Fremantle. Peel was assigned 250,000 acres on condition that they arrived by a certain date. Unfortunately they were six weeks late and the land was re-allocated. They were then assigned another 250,000 acres further south along the banks of the Murray River which ultimately failed because of flooding from the winter rains.

Having endured much hardship, Adam decided to return to Mandurah as had most of the other settlers and then to Perth. He eventually acquired a grant on the Swan River which he called 'Dalkeith', the name of the village near where he grew up in Scotland. Life was difficult and he grew grapes and figs (the cuttings of which he brought from Cape Town when the 'Gilmore' called there on the way to Fremantle), also melons and vegetables and he also raised goats.

He ultimately sold the farm and moved back to Mandurah with his 3 youngest children, bringing his sister, Elizabeth, out from Scotland to housekeep for him. He acquired 1,200 acres, 800 acres just off the Murray River and another 400 acres on the river. He named it Ravenswood. George and John took up land at Serpentine when it was opened up. They also had a timber cutting business on the Canning. Francis Fraser had a keen interest in Aboriginals and at the age of 21 applied for and was appointed Superintendent of Native Tribes and Native Interpreter in the Courts of Justice.

He was also a foundation member of Wesley Church, Perth. Christopher built a house at Mandurah and became a publican. Laura married Thomas Tichbourne Montgomery and moved to Canada. Adam Armstrong Senior returned to Ravenswood in 1839 and farmed the property until his death on 9 September 1853 and is buried on the property.
