Walter Padbury sailed from England, accompanied by his father, Thomas, on the small barque 'Protector' The boy, Walter, was 11 years old, Within a few months of arrival in the Colony his father had died. He was homeless orphan in a hostile land. He was a lad with prodigeous courage and energy. He worked as a builder's labourer, servant, roustabout, barman and shepherd. He cleaned out stables and pigstys. He was a contract fencer then a cattle and sheep trader and overlander. He married Charlotte Nairn in the Court House 23 April 1844. Charlotte died 2 February 1895 aged 68 years. Walter was shattered. The couple had no children. Walter became the Colony's First Millionaire and Australia's greatest philanthropist. Walter Padbury died Thursday, 17 April 1907. He was buried in the East Perth Cemeteries with his beloved wife Charlotte. Walter left most of his estate to the Church of England.

Biography

On his arrival in the Swan River Colony William Frederick Seymour using his birth name Frederick William Palmer was immediately despatched northward in the 'Lady Stirling' as the incumbent whaling crews refused to work with the new whaling team. They were immediately successful in taking one whale. In 1842 he was issued with a Sawyers Licence. It was also in 1842 that a list of unclaimed letters were published including one for Palmer, F.W. William was befriended by the Scott family of Bunbury. He was involved with the Bunbury Koombana Whaling Co. In 1844, he was one of eight men indicted for stealing from the beach at Bunbury - three casks of oil, the property of George Leake, Esq. The jury, after hearing all the evidence, returned a verdict of acquittal against all the prisoners. William Frederick became involved with the Castlerock Fisheries and from 1846 kept extensive records of catches, expenditure and daily life in a series of diaries now held in the Battye Library. In the 1848 diary he starts using the name William Frederick Seymour. Before leasing property from George Layman, William agisted his animals with George Chapman's herd. Later he purchased his own properties in Dunsborough and Yallingup. William Frederick Seymour married Mary Scanlon at Waterloo Farm. They had nine children. The three eldest girls died tragically at an early age, two in 1867 and one in 1869. January 1868 saw the family enveloped in another tragedy whereby William was indicted for the shooting death of his ticket-of-leave employee Thomas (Sam) Davidson. During the trial William is referred to as 'Seymour' and in other instances as 'Palmer'. William was finally acquitted and returned to the farm at Dunsborough. The last tragic years had taken their toll and William Frederick Seymour died on 10th August, 1874, aged just 54. In the burial list of St Mary's Church Busselton 1873 and 1874, William's death is recorded as N 112. NB: Convict William Frederick Seymour (No.99) arrived in the Colony October 1850. He worked for a Mr Wellard in Fremantle and never ventured to the Vasse area again. He is often confused with William Frederick Seymour - Whaler and farmer in the Vasse area - Dunsborough.

John and Ann were married 24 August 1818 and a few years later learning of the opportunity of owning their own land, joined others in the Thomas Peel enterprise. Unfortunately they found one set back after another, losing their horses and cattle while trying to land on shore here, they found Thomas Peel had lost the land which was to have been granted to them, due to the late arrival of the ship 'Rockingham'. However, 'when the going gets tough, the tough get going' and this is what they did.

John was part of a group sent south to work land which had been given to Peel, but a petition sent to Governor Stirling dated 30 August 1830 stated ' they agreed to work as field hands for Thomas Peel for 3 shillings per day, only having fresh provisions twice since landing and the last they had they could not eat it being so bad'.

John and Ann moved their family north to Perth and Guildford where John worked as a labourer. Little Hannah died from burns at Guildford 11 September 1831.

John applied for government assistance on 6 January 1834. Flour was given out in return for men working on road works and /or government projects and be paid 3 shillings per day to cover cost of supplies.

Later in 1835 John was a ferryman at Guildford. He was assigned Lot 86 on 17 September 1830 and Lot 87 on 9 September 1834. The family was also mentioned in the Census taken in 1832 and 1837 but James was not mentioned in the latter. It is believed he may have drowned.

From the family of eight children there are many descendants. Some moved to South Australia and Victoria. Ann moved to South Australia with Elizabeth a few years after John's death and remarried in 1848. Ann died in 1882. Many of the descendants became farmers, soldiers (in the Boer War, WW1 and WW20), civic leaders in their community, one the first Miss Australia and another ADC to the Governor General of Australia.

John and Ann would have been proud of the families and what has been achieved by so many because they took that step to go out into the unknown.

In Fremantle the family managed a bakery, a butchery, a tannery (Pearse Bros., Boot Factory) and invested in such diverse enterprises as Fremantle Gas and Coke Company and the Fremantle Soap and Candle Co and the Adelaide Steamship Company. William Silas (born 1838) was the most politically active family member and was by 1887 a member of the Legislative Council. As such he was active in decision making, particularly re the establishment of the first Fremantle Hospital and Fremantle Harbour.

Other family members were great developers of land, pastoral and urban, and all had a strong social conscience, typified by the donation by Francis Pearse's widow in 1919 of her Harvest Road, North Fremantle home to the Salvation Army. The family provided employment (e.g. for 280 persons initially in the Boot Factory which continued until 1952) and also a firm ethical basis for the advancement of W.A. Two Fremantle churches were supported by the Pearse family - the (now gone) Johnston Memorial Congregational Church and St. Johns Anglican Church. They built some fine homes - five in North Fremantle (three still standing).

Descendants of the early Pearse's were given a fine example and today you will find them in a huge range of occupations and professions. From their proud heritage most have derived interest and will to support historical recording of Western Australia.

William died 6 April 1866 at Fremantle and Susannah died 5 November 1879 (aged 61yrs) also at Fremantle.

Martha arrived as a servant to John Randall Phillips, they later married on 1 August 1839 at Canning (Perth District Registration). Granted 2000 acres at Canning and 2600 Acres at Plantagenet. Land at Fremantle Lot 271, Perth Lot I2 both in 1830. Carried out location duties for Gilbert and Hobbs on locations 13 and 14 and in time gained possession of the land.

John Randall Phillips early attempts to take up residence on the Canning were hampered by bad luck. In April 1830, as he was preparing for the journey, all his provisions, including seeds and other vital stores were destroyed by fire resulting from an Aboriginal burn-off. Replacement goods did not arrive in the Colony until December 1840, nevertheless, by August, Phillips was on the Canning, living in a tent on AH Gilbert's location 13, preparing to select a new grant for himself to undertake location duties for Gilbert. But more bad luck followed.

In October he was badly speared in the side during an altercation with Aborigines, and it was not until December that he actually received his grant and started location duties on Gilbert's land. Only then did he begin to develop his property, which he called 'Maddington Park' (farm) situated on the right bank of the Canning River just below its confluence with the Southern River. Nairn bought 'Maddington Park' for £2,340, from John Randall Phillips in 1830. Also had land at Albany Lots B5, S5, Sub B8 in 1833. In 1834 he was a JP. In September 1835 Government Resident Hotham, March 1836 Magistrate at Williams River District, 1838 Government Resident at Canning, Resident Magistrate at Albany in 1840-1847 and Inspector of Natives and Chairman of Albany Quarter Sessions. Was one of the first to take up land in the Williams District. Went to South Australia per the 'Alpha' 7 December 1846 and returned later that year.

John died 27 December 1852 at Albany of influenza and is buried in the heritage cemetery at Albany, but no headstone exists.

Martha died in 1857 at Kanyaka Station in South Australia at the age of 46 years. After the death of her husband she went to live with John Randall Phillips Jnr who had the lease on Kanyaka Station, north of Quorn. Her grave with intact headstone is in the heritage cemetery at Kanyaka ruins.

Charles Pratt married Ann 19 July 1814 at London, England. On 25 January 1830 the 'Eagle' arrived at the Gage Roads from Gravesend via St Jago and St Paul Island. Among the 28 passengers were the ship's owner James Solomon, his sister Ann, her husband Charles Pratt and their two children Charles Edward Pratt (age 15) and Ann Ellen Pratt (age 14). On February 16 1830, Pratt was advised that he was entitled to select 8,986 acres. However further lands were to be opened up before he could make a selection. Pratt acquired Fremantle Town Lots 95, 96, 97 and 98. A store and alehouse were erected on part of Lots 95 & 96. Pratt purchased the 'Eagle' for 2000 pounds from James Solomon and began trading with the eastern colonies. By August 1830 Pratt was very disillusioned and moved his family to Van Diemens Land, leaving Solomon to manage the Fremantle store. Over the next 3 years he sailed between Mauritius, Sydney and Van Diemens Land. As Pratt's trade with Mauritius had developed he returned his family to Fremantle in June 1834 to take over management of the Fremantle store. In July 1836 Pratt was granted Avon Location W - 7986 acres near Northam. He called these properties 'Buckland' and 'Wongamine'. A modest stone hut was erected, cattle and sheep were driven up and a shepherd employed. Pratt requested permission from the Governor on 15 November 1837 to sell spirits at a general store he proposed to open at Guildford 'not as an Inn, but a place where a poor person could buy a bottle at a time'. The store was near the river landing at Meadow Street. He purchased a house 'Bebe Moro' at Lot 95, also 40 acres near Success Spring (Swan location Q2). This land was used to pasture sheep and as a holding paddock for animals waiting for slaughter. A small butchering trade was added to his Guildford business in 1838. Charles died 11 October 1853 at Guildford and Ann died 9 October 1872 also at Guildford. Information was extracted from R.
