Biography

William who was known as 'Billy' and his wife Ann lived a short distance from London Bridge in an area known as Stepney Green. Stepney, where Billy who was a highly skilled 'locksmith' had his workshop at the rear of his house.

During the harsh winters of 1826/27 Billy approached Ann with the thought of emigrating to a warmer climate, with the Swan River Colony in mind. At that time a gentleman called Robert Lyon came on the scene. He talked the Nairns into emigrating as his servants and in turn he would look after them, on the understanding that he would live with them.

They left Plymouth on the 14 May 1829 on the Marquis of Anglesea, and arrived in the Swan River Colony on the 23 August 1829. In Fremantle Billy built a small humpy with a workshop attached. Another move was in 1830 to Perth Lot (G7) in King Street near Hay Street and a frontage onto St George's Terrace where another workshop was built onto their humpy.

In 1840 Lot S31 a large block fronting onto Adelaide Terrace and stretching down to the Swan River was given as a free grant. By this time James had joined his Father in the workshop to learn the trade. Robert Lyon was a difficult man who had become rather unpopular in the Colony.

William and Robert fell out and there was a rather unpleasant parting of their ways. There was no shortage of work for Billy and James in their Blacksmith workshop, and the family progressed.

William Nairn died on November 28 1855. Mary Ann died on December 16 1870. They were buried together in the East Perth Cemeteries where their grave can still be identified.

Their eldest son James was a pioneer farmer on the Irwin River and also established 'Byro Station' in the Upper Murchison Region in 1874. Eldest daughter Margaret married Thomas Grigson and they farmed in the York region. Charlotte married Walter Padbury in April 1844.

Walter and Charlotte Padbury were the wealthiest couple in the Colony and were noted for their philanthropy. Emma married James Ogden a Hotelier in 1858. Both William (Jnr) and Jane Nairn eventually settled in South Australia.

Charles Nairn pioneered the first station on the De Grey River in July 1863. He was lost at sea in March 1867 on the ship 'Emma' which went down somewhere off the north west coast.

Ellen married twice, first to James Grieves until his death in 1866 and then to Richard Meares whose family were pioneer farmers in the York region.

He was promoted to Superintendent of Mounted Police. He formed a liaison with Rachel Burrows who was in service to Lady Stirling who had a child by him. The child was adopted by Mrs Charles Boyd. He left for Ireland 28 May 1836 per 'Sally Ann' proposing to return the Colony with stock. Charles died 7 March 1838 in Ireland at his father's home 'Marybro Park' without knowing of the birth of Rachel's daughter.

In the 1850's he moved to Fremantle and was a draper, grocer and general dealer in Henry Street. Biography

Married first time to 18 January 1838 at Perth to Caroline Flaherty, daughter of Edward John and Sarah Elizabeth Flaherty. Caroline died 21 March 1853. John married second Elizabeth Reilly 7 January 1855. When the Bohemian sugar bakers (Moravians) emigrated settling around Fulneck, Bristol and other places, amongst them were Okelys and Wippermans.

Some of these intermarried. The most eminent Okely was Francis, associate of Wesley. Over the years many Okelys went abroad, some to the USA, some as missionaries, and in the 1800's some came to Australia. After his brother Will settled in Fremantle John Peters Okely joined him, buying his implements and starting a bakery there.

Soon 1834, John shifted to Perth, where in 1838, he married the 15 year old Caroline. His business prospered and expanded till John began to diversify, selling imported products and hiring and racing horses. Things got out of hand when he experienced trouble paying his debts but he overcame this reversal in fortune (It is believed his double storeyed building in St Georges Terrace was at one time the old 'West Australian Newspapers premises).

Despite early deaths in the family John obtained a good living and continued at his occupation for about 48 years. Towards the end of his life he benefited from gardening. There was an infectious sense of hospitality and togetherness and gracious living for John Okelys family.

Emily was generous to a fault and used to cook masses of food for all comers.

John Peters Okely died at his home in St Georges Terrace on June 14 1884, just two weeks after the marriage of his daughter Arabella. He was laid to rest in the same East Perth Cemeteries plot as his daughter Amelia.

As a widow Elizabeth Okely remained in Perth where her daughter Arabella lived. She mourned the loss of her two youngest sons prior to her own death on November 4 1906. She is also buried at East Perth.
