She later helped son William develop a property 'Culbernine' at Meckering where the Kelly descendants continue to farm in 2003. Thomas Kelly moved to New South Wales after his marriage to Mary Cook in 1854.

Biography

David King, his wife Harriet Sophia (nee Newman) their son Henry and daughter Mary Ann, arrived at Fremantle on 5 August 1829. They came from the town of Downton, Wiltshire, England where they were married on 11 May 1823. David came to the Swan River Colony as an indentured servant to Wells and Latour. Had land at Fremantle Lot 244 in 1830. A second daughter Sophia May, was born to the couple on 17 September 1829. Tragedy struck the King family when Henry was drowned on 15 April 1830 on Colonel Latour's property. Later in the same year a double tragedy, David King himself drowned 7 February 1830. Harriet left to fend for herself and the two little girls, turned to sewing and meshing (mending fishing nets) for a living. But she was not left a widow for long. Harriet remarried John Stanton (Staunton) 14 March 1831, he was a private in the 63rd Regiment, and had three daughters by him. Catherine born October 1832, Annette born 1835 and Emma born February 1837. Harriet seems to have had trouble managing money, for on 30 March 1842, and again on 22 January 1845, John Stanton announced publicly that he would not be responsible for this wife Harriet's debts. Harriet died in Perth, 19 June 1866. Sophia's marriage registration records her as May Sophia King - she married James McNamara on 14 November 1849. But again tragedy struck - James died in February 1867, and Sophia not long afterwards, leaving their eight children to fend for themselves. Mary Ann married Louis Langoulant and lived until 1886, when she was killed on a railway crossing on 31 July at the age of 60 years.

Biography

James and Mary Ann married 18 January 1830 at St George's Cathedral, Perth - the first marriage in the new Swan River Colony. Mary Ann was 21, a farmer's daughter, Church of England and literate. James Knight was aged 22, an Innkeeper's son, Church of England, literate. Archdeacon Thomas Hobble Scott, Rector of Whitfield, Diocese of Durham officiated, witnesses to the marriage being Peter Brown and Sarah Blakey. On 18 October James was employed by Peter Brown as a Clerk in the Security Office at a salary of one hundred pounds per annum, a position he held for seven months till he resigned when repeated requests for a rise in salary was denied. (Government Gazette Records). On 29 May 1830, James and Mary sailed east on the 'Britannia' to purchase stock for their Augusta holding (Land Dept Register, 1829). In 1837 in a listing of 'Return of Lands in the Colonies' James is shown as having 640 acres at an average price of five shillings. While 'at sea' on the Britannia, 29 June 1830, he advised the Surveyor General that 'Mr R Clint' (was) his agent for the fulfilment of all conditions which I hold my entitlement. (Civil Service Register).

The couple's first two sons William Ambrose and Charles Edwin were born in the Bathurst district of NSW. Mary Ann and her children returned on the 'Currency Lass' on 21 October 1835. James may have returned earlier as he is not shown as a passenger on that voyage. The family are shown as residing in the colony in 1837 Census of Perth. James held positions in different Government departments. He was appointed Postmaster at Bunbury (August 1841), Tide Waiter (Customs Officer) at Bunbury (October 1841, and Clerk of the Magisterial Dept., Wellington St. Perth (December 23, 1842). He also held the leasehold for the Royal Hotel, Fremantle (28 April 1838) for approx. twelve months, and later the Bunbury Hotel (June 1844). About 1837 he acquired 1760 acres of land at Wonnerup in the new Vasse settlement, adjacent to land held by George Layman. When George Layman was speared by the aboriginal Gayware on 22 February 1841 Mary Ann revealed 'that a native had also made the threat to her and that furthermore had pointed to Layman as the white who would be speared through a window one night'. ('Busselton - Outstation on the Vasse' (1830-1850) by Rodger Jennings.

In a letter to the Collector of Revenue dated 1 April, 1851, James refers to 'my memo concerning my 20,000 acres in the Vasse' so by this time his allocation had grown considerably. Archdeacon Wollaston wrote in his diary (14 March 1851) that he 'called at Knight's on way. He has moved his house and doing much better, his sons with him, now grown up. He and Mrs Knight much the same as formerly except that I thought their adversity had somewhat affected them.' This was apparently the case as James and Mary gave up their land holdings and left the Colony with their family, sailing for Victoria aboard the ship 'Swan' on June 29, 1853.

Mary Ann died 12 September 1885 and James died 1 January 1888 at Morrison, Victoria.

Biography

William Knight was the second child of James and Mary Knight of Sussex, England. James died when William was six years old. His mother remarried and he and his siblings were raised by Thomas Godfrey of Hawkehurst, Kent. William and his older sister, Elizabeth, born 1800, arrived in the Swan River Colony in 1831, following in the footsteps of their younger brother James who had arrived on the Calista in 1829. Presumably James had encouraged his older siblings to join him.

In his early years in the Colony William was granted land in several locations. In 1832 he acquired a Town Lot in Perth (Lot L67) as well as land in the Avon and Canning River areas and the Plantagenet and Vasse districts. During this period Elizabeth Knight worked as a governess in the Vasse district. On 18 January 1837 at Perth, William married Harriet Mary Trigg. They had three children.

William Knight has many public positions over the following years. In 1841, Appointed to the Bank of WA, 1846 - Colonial Auditor, 1847 - Chairman, Board of Works, 1849 - Chairman Board of Works and at Post Office, Perth, 1850 - First Director, Treasurer - Perth Town Trust, 1854 - First Auditor General of WA, 1861 - Registrar General, 1862 - Acting Police Magistrate, Perth, 1862 - Acting Treasurer & Collector of Internal Revenue, 1869 - Census Commissioner, 1872 - Retired, 1874 - Deputy Sheriff, 1878 - Commissioner. In 1851 William Knight built Mount House on the side of Mt Eliza. The family moved into their new and quite palatial residence on 10 December 1851, and according to the diary of Alfred Hawes Stone, held a 'grand ball' there on New Years Eve. He also noted 'We had a pleasant evening. There were 60 or 70 people...plenty of dancing. The rooms are large and lofty and the floor of the dining room was dry rubbed with wax and turpentine and beautifully smooth. I had tuned up Knight's piano to concert pitch and also played the flute. We had champagne supper and plenty of it on the veranda, room for all to sit down comfortably'.

In 1853 William's brother James Knight and his family gave up their land in the Vasse district and left Perth for Victoria. William was given leave of absence and sailed to England with his wife and daughter per 'Isabella Blythe' on 18 March 1854, returning to Perth on 22 May 1855 per the 'Lady Amherst'. Shortly after there were changes in their domestic arrangements and William's sister Elizabeth returned from Vasse to live with him and assist with his family. Copies of letters written in the 1860's and 1870's by Elizabeth and William to James and his family in Victoria are still in existence. Mount House was bought by the Emu Brewery in 1955 for the sum of sixty five thousand pounds and used for a storehouse until it was demolished in February 1960. A chandelier from Mount House still hangs in the Western Australian Parliament House.

William died in Perth on 11 June 1881, his sister predeceasing him on 1 June 1877.

William and Sarah were engaged as servants to Cowcher and were granted 1320 acres in the Avon district. Had land at Guildford Lot 77 and Lot 78 in 1832. Fremantle Lot 246 in 1834. Sarah died 5 March 1831. William died and was buried 20 September 1836 - speared by natives. Son Edwin married Sarah Massingham.
