### **Biography**

James Inkpen married Lydia Adams on 28 April 1822 in Kent, England. James, Lydia and their first five children sailed on the 'Gilmore' arriving on 15 December 1829. Had Perth Lot G20, Lot O12 in 1830 and Guildford Lot 156 in 1832. James was one of the first settlers to set about establishing a Methodist Church in the Swan Settlement. James Inkpen and Fraser Armstrong must have been delighted with the news that a shipload of Methodist settlers on the Tranby was about to land in the Swan River Colony. They themselves had arrived in the dawn of the settlement, when Methodism was regarded as a sect and Methodists were dissenters. Inkpen may have already arranged for a Class Meeting in his own home, and the Church was to hear more of him in relation to land. Both men were to see the new Wesley Church built and opened in 1870 and to enjoy its membership. The first Methodist Chapel in Murray Street was built on James' land which was bought from him for 400 pounds. Lydia died 1863 and James died 11 August 1871 at Perth.

Married Elizabeth Courthope in England in 1836. There is another child mentioned in the BDWA 'Emily Agnes' but no record found. The family returned to England on 15 March 1854. Frederick Chidley Irwin was the son of Reverend James Irwin. He began his military career in 1808, seeing active service in Spain and Portugal, taking part in several of the major sieges, retreats and battles of the Peninsula War. In 1817/18 he was stationed in Canada and later in Ceylon. In June 1829 he arrived in the colony with a detachment of the 63rd Regiment per the 'Sulphur'. He acted as administrator of the colony in 1832 during Governor Stirling's absence, and was acting Governor of the Colony on the death of Lt. Col Andrew Clarke in 1846/7/8 until relieved by Capt. Charles Fitzgerald. He was promoted to Captain in late 1828, to Major in 1837 and to Lt. Col. in 1845. He retired from the army in 1854 and died in Cheltenham in 1860.

Departed the Colony on the 'Emma Sherratt' 21 August 1845 for England leaving his affairs in hands of his nephew Thomas who arrived on the 'Gilmore' in 1829.

## **Biography**

Thomas had Fremantle Lot 432 in 1833 and Perth Lot O10 in the same year. Married Elizabeth 3 June 1837 at Woodbridge, Guildford. Elizabeth was the daughter of Walter & Tabitha Jones. Thomas arrived to join his uncle Isaac Jecks who gave his power of attorney over his affairs when his uncle returned to England. He was a carpenter at Guildford, also a warehouseman and innkeeper at the 'Rose and Crown' in 1841. Part of the present hotel was built in 1841 by Thomas Jecks on the site of the original Inn, which was burnt down. This was the last place in many instances where the pioneers had contact with people before their journeys into what was then an unexplored hinterland.

He bought Town Lots in 1840, 1850 & 1853 and also two Lots at Rockingham in 1853. Agent for the 'Inquirer' 1847 and employed a ticket-of-leave man in 1879. He was Chairman of the Guildford Town Trust (Mayor). He was literate and of the Church of England faith.

Thomas died 24 January 1856 and Elizabeth 21 February 1888. The Jecks's are buried at the Guildford Grammar School Cemetery.

Edward and Cecelia married in 1825. Edward Jeffers owned Perth Town Lots V17, V18 and his wife owned Q11. He was discharged from the Army in 1834. Mentioned in the 1837 Census in the Perth district. Admitted to hospital in March 1837 with an injured knee (CSR 50). In November 1840 signed a petition for a Methodist Minister's stipend. On 18 November 1840 was named for non payment of location dues on Perth Town Lots V17 and V18. On 19 March 1841 was granted fee simple title to Lot 196 of 200 acres. In 1844 was a storekeeper in Perth. In July 1843 had a letter to the editor published in the 'Inquirer'. On 4 October 1843 was indicted for perjury, and sentenced to two years gaol with hard labour. In 1846, Mrs Jeffers a Roman Catholic, lodged a man named McRory, before his death, and there was a scandal over the priests trying to convert him while he was ill. In May 1847, one of Jeffers sons, whilst in Dom Rosando Salvado's employ, was lost in the bush near York, and found by Mr Drummond, Jnr. In July 1848 appeared as a witness in the James Hunt case. Edward, Cecilia and various family members left the Swan River Colony in the early 1850's for South Australia. They finally settled in Victoria.

## Biography

Although little is known of his early life, it is thought that his discharge from the British Army in 1829 is because of his impaired vision. Richard was accompanied by his wife Mary (nee Brown) and their two sons, Richard and William. Richard and Mary worked as servants to Lieutenant Henry Bull who also arrived on the 'Nancy' and who was granted land in the Swan region, a large parcel of which was in the Upper Swan. Richard and Mary were still employed by Lieutenant Bull on the Upper Swan property when in 1833 the aboriginal leader Yagan was shot and killed there. A thirty pound sterling reward had been placed on Yagan's head, and it would appear this was the motivation for the killing. Six more children were born to Richard and Mary after their arrival. When their daughter Amelia was born in 1842 they had settled at 'Cliffston' Upper Swan. Amelia married Edmund Keen (Kean) Byrne on 6 April 1866.

Richard owned a bullock team which traversed the Swan Valley area and to the railhead at Guildford. He carted produce and sandalwood to Guildford and back, loaded supplies for himself and other settlers in the area. It was a slow and arduous method of transport, and it is said that his booming voice, used to encourage his team to move faster, became his trademark. Family history records that Bullsbrook was named after him. He became known as Richard 'Bull' Jones, and one of his regular stopping and camping places was the nearby tributary of Ellen's Brook near the junction of the old Gingin and Bindoon Roads.

Richard died 8 April 1862 at Upper Swan. Mary died at Gingin 26 September 1885. This family is possibly also referred to John and Ann Jones who Bull referred to in application for land.

## Biography

Married 26 August 1821 in England. Richard and Louisa had five children and they were baptised in St. George in the East, Shadwell, Middlesex and they lived in High St., Shadwell Parish, Middlesex. Richard was a Plumber and Glazier. Another child Joseph was born in the Colony and Louisa died in childbirth complications 23 December 1830 at East Perth. The son lived for three months. They are buried at East Perth Cemeteries.

On the 5 September 1829 the first five lots of land were sold in Perth and later that year there were 230 more sales and Richard was one of these to purchase property. He purchased a block in St. George's Terrace between Barrack and William Sts on the right hand side looking towards Kings Park and the block of land went right through from the Terrace to Hay Street. Richard Jones did all the gold writing/lettering and etching of the Lord's Prayer and the Apostles Creed in the Perth Anglican Cathedral.

Richard was a member of the first Perth Town Trust. In the 1832 census he was listed as a publican. He later owned the 'Devonshire Arms Inn' with his son-in-law Thomas McHard. About 1854 Richard, his two sons Richard and William went south to the Blackwood to Balingup where they built 'Southampton House' and it still stands today. Later his widowed daughter Mary McHard joined them. They also built another house on the property 'Hampshire Cottage' for the workmen. They constructed a water mill and had just over 200 acres fenced and 27,300 acres leased with 600 cattle and 60 horses and the 'best machinery'. (Ref: The Inquirer).

On 11 January 1882 the property was up for sale. It was described as a cattle station with 9 rooms and cellars. Although Richard had the qualifications to survive in the town, the family was more interested in farming and between them helped to pioneer Wanneroo before moving to the Blackwood. The 'Daily News' 29 October 1885 notes that land owned by Richard Jones in Perth was sold for 8,000 pounds 'the highest price ever paid for a block in Perth up to that time'. It had frontage to St. George's Terrace.

Richard died 15 November 1876 at Blackwood - and is buried at East Perth.

Eldest son Abraham was in partnership with his brothers at the Woodbridge Inn. Abraham became Postmaster at Guildford and also conducted a small school for settlers sons and aboriginal children in 1841. Walter died 14 May 1868 at Guildford.
