Biography

Charles was a servant to Dr Milligan. Married 9 August 1831 at Perth officiated by the Rev JB Wittenoom. Had 10 acres at Rottnest (Kingston Lot 11) and 200 acres in the Swan district (Swan Loc 42). The ten acres at Rottnest were exchanged for ten acres along the Canning River on 17 November 1840 (Canning Location 39). Charles named this allotment 'Shaw Gardens'. Lost Perth Town Lot L45 due to nonpayment of dues in 1840. Charles died 27 July 1845 of tetanus and is buried in the East Perth Cemeteries. Margaret remarried Edward Bethel Downes 23 December 1846. Margaret Downes (formerly Farmer) died in 1848 aged 36 years.

Biography

Anne Evans was christened in Parish Newddwy, Dinas, Wales on 20 July 1806. She married Thomas Farmer 21 February 1826 in London, England. He was a soldier in the 63rd Regiment. They sailed with their first two children Thomas and William for the Swan River Colony. Anne was reputed to be in the first boat to be rowed up the Swan River to the future town of Perth on 18 June 1829. Thomas tragically drowned on the Flats in the Swan River on 23 February 1832. He is buried in the East Perth Cemeteries. Anne remarried William Watson 24 June 1832 at Bassendean. She was expecting Joseph at that time, so when he was born he was given the surname of Watson. Anne had three more children to William Watson. William Watson died at Perth May 1843. Anne's 3rd Marriage to Thomas Walker (a widower with five children) on 12 November 1843 - he died 4 months later. Anne died 27 December 1870 and is buried at the East Perth Cemeteries.

Dr J Wingate Johnson of HMS 'Sulphur' on 5 Oct 1831 replying to letter of 2 October respecting the health of Alexander Fendam, Government Cooper, stated, 'In his opinion Fendam is unfit for duty that requires exertion. He labours under general debility accompanied with indigestion and inguinal rupture.' Acc 36/18/36 - This Certificate was sent to Colonial Secretary by Colonial Storekeeper on 5 October 1831 (Acc 36/18/34-35) where he represented that Fendam the Cooper was incapacitated to perform his duties from continual indisposition. Alexander died 25 August 1833.

Alexander and Christiana married 27 June 1823 at Falkirk, Scotland. Servant of Lowis and Yule. The family settled on the Canning then moved to Middle Swan where they had six more children. They then moved to 'Barn Elms' Toodyay. Alexander's son James carried on as 'Smithy' assisting his father. He was an excellent tradesman and carried on painting, ploughing and shoeing horses. He continued leasing 'Barn Elms' after his father's death on 24 April 1858 at Toodyay. Christiana died 2 June 1870 at Toodyay. Son Alexander was the first burial in Nardie Cemetery.

Biography

Robert came from Aberdeen Scotland with his brother John Woodford Ferres. John died 3 October 1830 and Robert continued and finished the Round House building. Elizabeth Bateman arrived with father John Bateman and step-mother Mary Anne Bateman. Elizabeth had married William Ledgard who was transported in 1835 for seven years for plundering the wreck of the ship 'Cumberland'. By the time William had his ticket-of-leave Elizabeth had 5 children by Robert. It is possible that she obtained church dispensation as an abandoned wife to marry Robert. Robert and Elizabeth married 11 July 1848 at Fremantle. Robert was in a building partnership with Richard Morrell until it dissolved in 1843. Robert was the first to realise the qualities of the local limestone and established the lime kilns at Fremantle from which he supplied lime for the construction of many public and private buildings. For his services Governor Stirling granted him a limestone quarry, Lot 372 Fremantle on which now stands the old Signal Station and Army Barracks. He was contracted to pave Fremantle main streets in 1859. The introduction of convict labour deprived Robert of his livelihood and they departed in 1862. He and his family went to Sydney and in 1863 to South Australia where they subsequently died. Two sons returned to Western Australia in 1879 on the 'Spinnaway' to establish themselves as butchers in High Street having regained title to land at Lake Munster (near Woodman's Point) for fattening of stock.

Biography

Edward and Sarah married September 1812 at Kent, England. From the time the Flaherty's came to the Colony life was a struggle. According to the first census the eldest offspring was 18 and the baby Edward Frederick was then 2 months old. Their Peel Estate land was barren and infertile, and, while Edward was an excellent Latin scholar, he was not an experienced farmer. In January 1832, Flaherty was the licensee of a public house at Point Walter, but it was destroyed by a fire started by the natives. It was then necessary to Edward to seek employment as a labourer in order to recoup his funds. In 1850 daughter Ellen (10 years) died in a bullock cart accident. Several of the girls married at an early age and there was great wealth and extreme poverty. Eventually Edward senior managed the Roelands Farm at Flaherty's Brook. Edward died 17 April 1862 at Vasse and Sarah died 8 September 1865.

Biography

John Fleay departed on the ship 'Margaret' from England and transferred to the ship 'Drummore' at the Cape of Good Hope, South Africa. John Fleay arrived with William Tanner, as a servant, at aged sixteen.

He married Jane Cook 29 October 1832 (Perth Register). Daughter of Jeremiah and Mary Jane Cook. Mentioned in the 1837 Census at Perth. He went to York in 1839 and had ten children. He became a successful farmer and in 1853 applied for a 2000 acre pastoral lease.

In May 1840 his second son George at three and a half years of age, disappeared from the banks of the Avon River while helping mind the goats. He was never found. It was thought that he had been taken by natives. The eldest daughter Ellen died at 13 months from an unknown illness.

In 1848, three year old George (4th son) also succumbed. John Fleay was instrumental in starting the Gilgering (later called North Beverley) school for his own and his neighbours children.

Jane Fleay died on 1 May 1872 at York and John died 5 March 1884 at Gilgering.

Owned Avon location 32 - 816 acres at Toodyay. He was in charge of the 99th Regiment during absence of Elliott. Was a medical attendant at the convict depot between 1857 and 1861. Owned small freehold locations at Champion Bay and held pastoral leases. Died at Chapman River 15 June 1868. It is recorded that his wife applied to leave the Colony 5 January 1831 per the 'Eagle'.

William arrived with brother Henry. William Forward was an indentured servant to George Dunnage. He married Caroline Friend on 4 April 1838 at St. Matthew's, Guildford. In the 1837 Census he was an Innkeeper at Perth. He then moved to York. On 9 February 1842 he advertised Ram Stock on his property and in 1843 he advertised to take in sheep. In 1850 he applied for land. The same year he ran a conveyance between York and Perth once a month. In the 1860's he was a Hotelier and was farming at Salt River. William and Caroline raised a family of eight children. All children married and the total number of grandchildren was 72. William died 28 May 1893 at Northam and Caroline died 11 September 1899 also at Northam.

Biography

William Foster arrived with mother Elizabeth and stepfather John Tichbon and sister Mary Anne. William was an indentured labourer to Solomon Levey. According to the 1832 population census of Perth, William was aged twenty one years, single and born in Salehurst Sussex. Maria Read arrived with parents George and Elizabeth. William married Maria on 9 November 1836 at Perth. They had seven children - only one (Frederick George) did not survive. William signed his name to correspondence relating to the Government of Australian Colonies in 1837, in particular the high expenditure of buying and improving land in the new Colony. Being the owner of Lot D7, a block running between Adelaide Terrace and Howick Street, the house on this land was advertised to let in 1843 by William. It would appear that William had at some time been a farmer, possibly in the York/Northam district, as he mentions cattle herds and farming implements in his will in 1872. By the 1860's William was the licensee and Victualler of the 'Old Narrogin Inn' in Armadale. He met his untimely death in 1874, murdered by a servant. William Henry Foster died 14 February 1874 at Armadale and his wife Maria died 7 December 1884.

Captain Charles Howe Fremantle, in command of the HMS Challenger took formal possession of the west coast of Australia on 2 May 1829 - a month before the first European settlers arrived in the Swan River Colony. Captain Fremantle kept a diary which has been published. The City of Fremantle has been named after him, also Swanbourne and Cottesloe. He returned to England and married Isabella Wedderburn on 8 October 1836. They had three children. Charles died 25 May 1869.
