Biography

George and Elizabeth Read and their five children whose ages ranged from 10 to 21 years arrived on the ship 'Rockingham' as part of the Thomas Peel scheme. Literally dumped on the beach at Clarence the Reads appear to have spent some time there, hoping for Mr Peel to make good his promises, whilst building houses and receiving no payment. In August 1830 George signed his name on a petition requesting the assistance of the Governor to release those indentured servants to Peel. By all accounts this was approved and family history suggests that George and his family moved to Perth and built the first four roomed dwelling in Perth, situated in Mount Street. The wood and stone for the house being collected from Mt Eliza. It can be positively established that George applied for and was granted Perth allotment W19 in 1832. This lot was situated between Mackie Street (now Pier Street) and Wellington Street. In the 1832 population census George, described as a sawyer, and Elizabeth, were noted as living in Perth, with children Charles, Maria, Mark and Emma. Ethel was living at Guildford, a maid servant to John Parsons.

Correspondence relating to the grievances of the Colony sent to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies in London in 1835, shows George and both of his sons as having signed the petition and being involved in the shaping of the future of the Colony. George and Elizabeth's daughters Maria and Ethel married in 1836, Emma married in 1837. Mark married in 1842, while Charles remained unmarried. Elizabeth died at Perth 22 October 1857 and George died 13 March 1875.

James and Ruth Read (nee Hopkins) were both 15 years old when they married in St James Shaftsbury, Dorset, England on 28 August 1815, he was said to be a journeyman. James and Ruth came to the Swan River Colony with four children on board the 'Rockingham' arriving on 14 May 1830. Possibly two children James and John (James; baptised 3 February 1824; Gillingham, Dorset, England and John; baptised 26 February 1826; Gillingham, Dorset, England) died in England. They had another five children born in the Colony.

After residing in Mandurah and elsewhere for several years he ultimately made his home at Sulphur Town on Garden Island for about 30 years.

In 1859 James was brutally maltreated by escaped convicts who robbed him of 150 pounds and destroyed his boat so he could not communicate with the mainland until the harbour authorities visited the island two weeks later. After their experience the Read family left Garden Island.

After leaving the Island he occupied a small cottage on the beach at the corner of Russell Street and Marine Terrace Fremantle where he had a garden. In 1869, the blocks in Marine Terrace between Norfolk and Russell Streets were all vacant because of sand drift and encroaching sea. The Government gave grants for compensation.

It was noted that James Read made an application for Allotment 47 in Mouat Street Fremantle.

Ruth Read died 15 July 1873, wife of James Read 'House Proprietor'.

James went to live in South Australia where he died as a 'Gentleman' in Goolwa, South Australia on 26 February 1878.

Married 1824. In 1829 George Rewell indentured himself as a labourer to the Henty family who had chartered a sailing ship the 'Caroline' to take themselves and their people to the Swan River Colony.

In 1832 George Rewell accepted a 200 acre land grant in the Avon Valley but he was never to work the land and it was returned. The reason he did not take up the land was probably because of the drastic food shortage and trouble with the aborigines. By 1833 George and Jane had two more sons - another daughter was born 1835. Had Perth Lot 35 in 1831. Land at Albany Lot 93 in 1833. The daughter was only to live three years and another son was born and died in 1839.

By 1840 George is recorded as being employed as a fisherman and gardener. Their last child, a daughter Lucy was born in 1840. In 1843 George Rewell advertised in the 'Inquirer' newspaper that his licenced boat the 'Ocean Queen' would travel daily between Perth and Fremantle and the passenger fare was three shillings. The competition on the Swan River was fierce and he obviously did not have the capital to keep going and to be mentioned in any records.

George died 16 December 1875 at his home in Mounts Bay Road. The obituary in the 'WA Times' on the 24 December 1875, speaks of the respect and esteem George Rewell earned for himself in the Colony.

Jane Rewell went to live with eldest daughter Ann (married name Bowra) after George's death. Jane survived her husband by eight years and died on the 30 September 1883 in the Bowra house in Goderich Street. The death certificate indicates that Jane had a broken thigh, so she must have had a fall and did not recover. Jane Rewell was 85 years old at her death and the obituary in the 'Inquirer' newspaper named her as one of the oldest residents in Western Australia.

George and Jane Rewell are buried in the East Perth Cemeteries.

Benjamin Robins came from Hertfordshire and arrived in Fremantle on the Atwick 25 April 1831. He was an indentured servant to William and Arthur Trimmer and cared for their merino sheep on the ship. By 1836 he was employed as a shepherd on GF Moore's Avon grant and receiving a quarter of the increase of the flocks as well as cropping a small area. The 'Swan River Guardian' of 13 October 1836 records that Robins had cleared 10 acres and had 500 sheep. In July 1835 he purchased Helena Location 7 which he named 'Waterhall' on the south side of the Helena River.

He continued his interest around York and Beverley and was listed in the 1837 Census as living in York district. Ben Robins became recognized as a breeder of quality workhorses and is reputed to have been a butcher with a butcher shop in Guildford.

Benjamin was thirty when he married eighteen year old Elizabeth Mary Devenish of Guildford on 8 July 1838. Elizabeth was the daughter of William and Elizabeth Baldwin Devenish from Sussex. They arrived on the Hooghly 12 February 1830 as part of the disastrous Peel scheme. Released from their indenture in 1832 they set up as innkeepers and brewers on a grant at Guildford. It is said Devenish visited Guildford and met Robins who returned with him and transported the Devenish family to Guildford.

Benjamin and Elizabeth had fourteen children. Benjamin died at Guildford 1 December 1863 and Elizabeth (Betsy) died 15 March 1913.

Biography

Married 7 January1829. John Septimus Roe and his wife Matilda arrived at the Swan River Colony on board the 'Parmelia' in 1829. John was the first Surveyor General of the new colony. Although he had an assistant, the man was often sick which left a load on John's shoulder especially with the large amount of surveying required within a short time and the many ships arriving with new settlers wanting land. To this was the added burden of may extra duties that he was given by the Governor.

On Roe's recommendation the sites of Perth, Fremantle Port, parks and gardens were selected. Planning was carried out with meticulous care. An outstanding bushman Roe was a sound explorer and, as well as may minor explorations he carried out eight major explorations and was held in high esteem and the colonists considered any reports written by Roe was ten times greater than by others. Roe was also a member of the first Council, Director of the first bank; Fellow of the Geographical Society, J.P., and chairman and member of many other organisations.

Altogether he served as Surveyor General for 42 years with distinction. Matilda Roe was well liked for her lovely, sweet nature and was a moral support and great comfort for her overworked husband. Their city home was in Adelaide Terrace and their farm 'Sanford' was in the Swan district. They also owned a number of other properties as they received land for payment of work.

Matilda died 22 July 1870 and John died 28 May 1878 at Perth.

Father and children appear on the September 1829 Muster. William Henry Rosevear arrived in Van Diemens Land from the Colony at Swan River with his four of his children in 1829. He married for a second time to Mary Burton on 19 November 1829 in Hobart, Van Diemens Land. He had spent most of his working life as a farmer in Cornwall, England, and, in view of his experience on the land, was granted 640 acres (256 hectares) in the West Tamar. He was granted a further 430 acres (172 hectares) 10 years later in 1839. The land was used for orcharding and other agricultural pursuits. Rosevear was also a publican, holding the licence of the Half Way House between 1833 and 1834, and was listed as the licencee of the Rose Inn in 1835 and again between 1848 and 1851. The Rose Inn was first licensed in 1831 and trades today as the Rosevear Waterfront Tavern. Sections of the interior retain the original brickwork. Rosevear described himself in the census of 1848 as being in the "Landed Proprietors, Merchants, Bankers and Professional persons class". William died in 1860, aged 73 at Launceston, Tasmania and Mary (Burton) Rosevear died in 1869.

Biography

Richard and Elizabeth Rowland had the distinction of being married on the Indian Ocean, in the Captain's cabin 11:30am on the 12 January 1830 onboard the 'Tranby'. They were indentured to the Clarksons for a period of three years working on the farm at the Peninsula Maylands for 10 pounds a year, this expired in 1833. Elizabeth was granted twenty and a half acres at the Peninsula but relinquished it in 1844, as the necessary improvements had not been carried out. Had Perth Lot W77 in 1833. In December 1830 Elizabeth selected 200 acres owing to her, this land was slightly north east of York across the Avon River. It is not known if the Rowlands' moved to York or ever improved the land for it to be granted freehold.

In 1834 Richard was granted 200 acres of land and stock in the Perth shire, in return 1/3 of his produce went to Clarksons as rent. He employed 3 Ticket-of-Leave men, he was also granted a small allotment in Wellington Street Perth. Despite the drought, floods and other hardships they made a home for themselves on the Peninsula. They both signed a petition for a Methodist Ministers stipend in November 1840.

In August 1841 he was elected to the board of the Wesleyan Society. Later in life Richard moved to Dongara where he owned and leased farming land and qualified to be a juror because of his assets.

Richard died on 15 August 1883 aged 82 and Elizabeth died on 8 June 1892 aged 86. They are both buried at Dongara.
