William Martin was a farm labourer indentured to Thomas Peel. Peel's venture failed. Had Guildford Lot 87 in 1830. They then took up a Town Lot in Perth (W7) for a few years and then moved to the Swan District.

In the 1837 Census they were recorded at 'St Leonards', near Guildford. William and family had moved to Northam by the 1850's and appears to have tenanted 'Woodley Farm' (later Oakover). William also leased for many years Location 0 owned by WJ Brockman. In 1871 William purchased 697 acres of neighbouring Location 62 from George Shenton and with his sons John and George was farming a substantial area in the region. This was known as Salt River Farm. William was an established farmer and grazier of some note in the Toodyay area by 1857.

William and Lucy's children married into other pioneering families in the Swan District and Northam area, including Minchin, Forward (Friend), Christmass and Delmage (Tapper).

Lucy died 13 April 1894 at Northam. William died at Northam aged 89 on 18 January 1895 - he was described in his obituary as 'an old settler'.

He was held in the highest esteem here, having so many sterling qualities. Some of the family are still farming in the Grass Valley area.

Biography

Captain Richard Goldsmith Meares formerly of the Second Life Guards (Household Cavalry) arrived at Fremantle in December 1829, with his wife, eight children, and his brother Peyton.

Captain Meares had achieved distinction as an Officer under the great Duke of Wellington during the Napoleonic Wars. Richard and Eleanor married in Newcastle on Tyne, England on 18 January 1808.

The Meares family journeyed with Thomas Peel in the Gilmore, having paid Peel 500 pounds for supplies and land. He moved to Cockburn Sound, where he acquired 15 acres of land and he and his family camped on the beach in a large marquee near the planned site of the town of Clarence.

Eventually he was able to obtain land at Guildford, whence he moved in 1832, and where he had built a house - 'The Bower'. The family owned several town lots at Guildford in 1830.

In 1834 he was appointed District Superintendent for the Police for Guildford. The same year he, together with his son Seymour, was involved in the 'Battle of Pinjarra'.

In 1837 he was appointed Justice of the Peace, and in 1840 Government Resident for the Murray District, where he had been allotted some 20,000 acres of land around the site of the present Pinjarra. About this time he acquired land at York which property he named 'Auburn' and gradually sold his interests in the Murray District.

From 1841 until 1859 he served as Government Resident of York. He had been the first Chairman of the Guildford Road Trust, he was a Director of the Agricultural Society of WA., and the first Secretary of the Stud Club formed in 1839.

His wife Eleanor died 20 July 1854 and Capt. Meares died 9 January 1862 at 'Auburn' York. Both are buried at the site of the old cemetery on Avon Terrace, York.

William, a carpenter, worked for Dr Joseph Harris, as an indentured servant at his Upper Swan property 'Strelley' until December 1833, when dissatisfied with his employment, he left to seek improved conditions elsewhere in the Colony. After a week or so, having had no luck, he was returning to his family and employer, when he was induced to swim in the river at Upper Swan and was accidentally drowned. He was buried at Guildford, but the grave location is unknown.

Hannah Melroy remarried 31 December 1834 to Daniel Syred at Guildford. A daughter Mary Ann, was born on 16 February 1836 in Perth. When the child was young, the family lived in a tent at the bottom of Mill Street, near the Swan River in Perth. In the 1840's William (junior) and his brother Henry worked for James Stokes at his Albion brewery, but tragedy again struck when Henry died of tetanus, after treading on a rusty nail. It appears that in 1842-43, Stokes probably returned William to England to further improve his knowledge of brewing, and in due course he progressed to become foreman of Stokes' Albion/Stanley Brewery.

Between 1848 and the early 1850's, Henry Saw, a business man, was engaged by Stokes to perform the accounting duties for the brewery, and in 1853 married William's half-sister Mary Ann Syred. Over the years they had six children. Hannah Syred (widow Meloy) husband Daniel, apparently left the Colony in 1845, and in 1858 Hannah married for a third time, to Charles King - a wheelwright.

A year earlier William married Elizabeth Arnold. They had two sons who died young, but in 1862 were fortunate to have twin daughters, Selina and Hannah. For the time being events seemed to run smoothly, but in 1869 William and Mary's mother - now Hannah King died. Henry Saw died in 1870 and in 1871 Charles King - Hannah's third husband. When James Stokes died in 1861, his will stipulated that William Meloy and Henry Saw should continue to run the brewery. William was unhappy about methods to be introduced by new owners/management at the Stanley Brewery, so he left in 1871 and set up his own brewery called Colonial Industries on his property at the corner of Hay and Milligan Streets, where the Melbourne Hotel now stands.

The venture met with little success, so he and his wife ran a public house, which the family continued after William Meloy's death in 1890 at the age of 62 years.

James and Elizabeth married 15 January 1821. James Minchin was a carpenter and later an agriculturist. After arriving in Fremantle, on the 'Caroline' he was given permission to obtain a land grant of 1,211 acres on the Upper Swan River and acquired a farming, grazing and wine growing property he named 'Spring Park Farm' - the purchase of which was completed by his third son, Alfred. This property remained in the family until 1946. Also had Perth Town Lot G8 in 1829. In July, 1837 James met his death by choking on a bone and was buried on 20 July 1837 alongside five other settlers who were speared to death by aborigines. George Fletcher Moore of 'Millendon' read the burial service. The burial site was on the Baskerville Estate and is not marked by a monument and in later years was an orange grove. In 1936 the descendants of James Minchin placed a marble tablet inside 'All Saints Church' Upper Swan as a memorial to James. After James' death his widow, Elizabeth made a living as a laundress, and in May 1838 remarried Jonathon Woollard. James (Jnr) and Andrew worked for George Fletcher Moore at 'Millendon' and Alfred and Eliza were engaged as servants at 'Oakover' the estate of Samuel Moore. During the 1850's the entire family with the exception of Alfred Minchin migrated to Victoria and New South Wales. Alfred Minchin settled at 'Spring Park Farm' and on 17 August, 1850 at All Saints Church married Lucy Martin (who arrived on the Hooghly, 13 February 1830). Alfred and Lucy had a large family of eight sons and two daughters and made their barn available as a school room for the district. Alfred and Lucy are buried together at 'All Saints Church'.

He married again and returned to India where two of the second family were born. Blaney his first child by his second wife - born 12 November 1832; Nasik, India; died 1833.

He resigned from the Church Missionary Society and was then employed by the Australian Missionary Society in 1838.

He came to the Swan River Colony with his family to establish All Saints and St Mary's Churches on the Swan. He became the first rector of the Swan Parish as from 1842. He served 20 years on the Swan and then became Padre of the prison in Perth, with the family living at the Deanery.

He died 3 August 1870 at Perth. His family all settled in Western Australia, and they in turn became pioneers of various districts.

Lawrence enlisted in 21st Regiment of the Fusiliers at Kells, 18 March 1826. He married Eliza O'Reilly at Marybro, 18 March 1827 and two children were born before they left Ireland. In March 1833 they sailed from Chatham, England. Lawrence was a guard over the convicts as far as Van Diemens Land and they arrived in the Swan River Colony September 1833. Ann attended the Barracks school before the Regiment moved to Albany in 1836. In 1840 Lawrence was discharged at his own request. He joined the Police Force on May 23 1857. He retired in 1868. He applied to be a lighthouse keeper at Point King. Lawrence died 14 February 1895 at Albany and Eliza died 25 February 1885. The Mooney's were some of the first known Catholics in Albany and their home was used for all services until the first church was built c1860. There is a panel in the stained glass window in the new church that commemorates their contribution to the Catholic Church in Western Australia. Married 4 October 1833 in England. Irish born Samuel Moore (1803-1849) joined his older brother George Fletcher Moore (appointed Advocate General in WA in 1834) in April 1834, over three years after the latter had arrived in the Swan River Colony (October 1830). Five weeks before leaving Britain, Samuel married Dora Dalgety. Land at Perth Lot Y15 in 1834, They settled at 'Oakover' on the Middle Swan, where six children were born to them, all but one reaching maturity. 'Oakover' became renowned for its hospitality and its owner kept a careful record of its farming activities, which is still extant. In addition he was involved in business pursuits in the Port of Fremantle, and was an active participant in community affairs. He was a Chairman of the Agricultural Bank in 1841 (the year of its foundation), a Director of the Agricultural Society, a committee member of the WA Mining Co and a steamship company, a Member of the Legislative Council and a Justice of the Peace. The Moores' lost their fifth child in tragic circumstances in 1846, and only three years later Samuel succumbed to a heart condition, and died on 4 July 1849 at Middle Swan, leaving his widow with a young family aged from thirteen down to three years. The eldest and youngest sons William Dalgety Moore and Samuel Joseph Fortescue Moore, made significant contributions to the Colony, one in the Port of Fremantle, the other in the Irwin district. Both were Members of Parliament. The second son left the Colony in his early teens to join Dalgety & Co. serving with that company in New Zealand, Tasmania and New South Wales. Dora Moore died in 1877.

Henry's grave head stone outside All Saints Church Middle Swan reads in part: 'One of the oldest Settlers who successfully contended with the early difficulties of the Colony'.

Henry died 6 December 1876 at Chittering.

After the Morleys' arrival in 1830 they lived in Upper Swan for the next twenty three years. Granted Perth Lot O2 in 1830. Henry and Sarah's family grew to five daughters and three sons. They all worked under primitive working conditions. Tilling small acreages the soil to cultivate of wheat and barley, plant vegetables and fruit trees and bred from a few animals.

At fifty years of age Henry purchased 20 acres to farm in Chittering for 20 pounds. Five years later he purchased an additional fifteen acres. The family home was built and in the late 1850's a large barn was constructed by convict labour. The barn's 60 square metre wooden floor provided the isolated local farming community the opportunity to attend occasional social dances accompanied with an accordion player.

The Morley family would travel a distance of 40kms to Guildford and would exchange farm produce (barter) for credit to purchase cloth and iron implements. Sarah Morley, pioneering wife and mother raised three grandchildren as a second family. Within a week after the death of her daughter Caroline in 1862, Sarah at the aged of fifty-six years travelled by horse drawn buggy to Greenough. Sarah was determined to retrieve her grandchildren because Daniel Baughan, Caroline's widower had no satisfactory means to support his children who were aged, one, three and six years old. Sarah travelled 12 hours a day, resting to water the horse. Sarah, to ensure that she safely made that arduous journey trip hobbled the horse at night. The round trip lasted 25 days covered 400kms along a bush track. Sarah died 2 August 1884 at Upper Swan.

Both Henry and Sarah are buried at All Saints Church, Upper Swan. Reference: 'A True Pioneer Settler' published December 1976 by Douglas Jecks.
