### **Biography**

Poll Susannah Curtis arrived with mother Mary Curtis. Edward Back was a crewman on the ship 'Fanny'. The ladies had come from London and transferred to Anthony Curtis' ship the 'Fanny' in Mauritius. Edward knew the owner Anthony Curtis from their time in the Royal Navy. He held the licence for the 'Stag Inn' (Fremantle) owned by Anthony Curtis. Edward married Poll Susannah Curtis 29 September 1837 at Fremantle. He was also the Acting Harbour Master at Fremantle in 1842-1844 and was the Pilot at Rottnest 1846-1857. The couple had seven children when Governor Fitzgerald directed Edward Back to live on Rottnest. The family lived there for nine years and had four more children - two of whom died in infancy. They left Rottnest in 1857 and Edward Back found work around Fremantle, sometimes as Acting Harbour Master. Poll Susannah died in 1885 aged 78 years and Edward died in 1886 aged 73 years.

### **Biography**

Thomas and Ann Bailey and their four children arrived at the Swan River Colony per 'Gilmore' on 15 December 1829 under the ill-fated Thomas Peel scheme. Ann died in childbirth on 16 August 1830 (32 years) at Clarence - thus causing Thomas a great deal of hardship. On 2 November 1830, Thomas was granted permission by the Governor to select two allotments in the Northern part of Fremantle (Lots 238 & 252 in November 1830) to establish a timber yard (Surveyor General Office Entry 334) followed by a further request (Entry 372). Thomas was still at Clarence April/May 1831 according to letters written to Peter Brown the Colonial Secretary (CSR.36.Vol 14/102 & Vol 15/53) and Eliza Bay in 1832 (Vol 23/160 & 16/133). In the 1836 Census the family were at Melville Waters but in the 1837 Census the family were living at York. Thomas died while living on his property 'Waterhatch' Beverley on 14 February 1856. A daughter Ann Elizabeth married Charles Heal at Springdale, York on 19 February 1842.

Sarah, daughter of Richard and Sarah Christmass, was baptised at Deptford, Kent in 1763. Sarah married Richard Baldwin (born 1762) at St Martin in the Fields, Middlesex, on 17 April 1787 in the presence of James Milton and Elizabeth Christmass, her sister. Children born to Sarah and Richard were: Elizabeth (22 March 1788) Charles (29 July 1790), Richard (26 September 1794) and Sarah (2 January 1799 - died 10 October 1800). After the death of her husband she travelled to the Swan River Colony with son-in-law William Devenish and daughter Elizabeth. By 1837 she was a servant with the Whitfield's.

Several reasons may be put forward for her accepting a position of servant in a York household so late in life (74 years of age). One could be Sarah's own desire for independence with the knowledge that she did not have to rely on her son-in-law for sustenance. William and Elizabeth established the family in Guildford, and although Sarah's energy would be missed, there would be one person less to sustain. The children were old enough to provide dedicated labour for the family business. Elizabeth Mary (Betsy) was soon to marry Benjamin Robins on 18 July 1838, and Betsy set about proving that she had inherited her Gran's resilience. It is possible that when Ben and Betsy's babies began arriving, Sarah applied her energy to her granddaughter's household. It is also possible that the Devenish family, whose musical talents are legendary, had Sarah to thank for a little part of this gift.

Mrs Baldwin died at Guildford in April 1851, aged 88 years.

### **Biography**

John and Elizabeth Barnard and their four children, Edward aged 11 years, William aged 6 years, Ann aged 4 years, and Charles aged 2 years arrived in 1829 on the ship 'Lotus'. John was listed as a labourer indentured to Colonel Peter Latour and the family was at Clarence when the General Muster took place early in 1830 and were still there when Charles, their youngest child died of typhus fever in March of the same year. A letter from John, dated 28 May 1831, to his home village of Sullington in Sussex bears testimony to the fact that those indentured to Latour were discharged by this time and he and Edward had gained employment 'under a private gentleman' as he put it. John described as a farming servant, Elizabeth and children are recorded in the 1832 population census as living in Perth, although their fifth child Ellen Jane is said to have been born at Clarence in 1834. In 1837 at the time of the census the Barnards were renting at Daviot Park, a property in Middle Swan and then were farming and living at Sandalford, another property adjacent to Daviot Park, in 1845 when Elizabeth died. Both John and Elizabeth are noted as farmers. A memorial of land shows the sale of the north east section of Perth building allotment H6 by John Barnard to Mark Read - John's son-in-law, in 1859. Edward their eldest son never married. William married in 1867 but had no children. Ann married in 1842 to Mark Read and after her death in 1855, Mark married her young sister Ellen Jane in 1860. There were twelve children from these two marriages.

William Barnard was a carpenter by trade but he was indentured to Thomas Peel as a labourer. He was released from his indentures on 24 July 1830, as Peel had not honoured his contract. Ann Higgs was a servant to Captain and Mrs Eliza Shaw of 'Belvoir'. She had two daughters before her marriage to William on 22 January 1838. Mary Higgs Barnard born 1835 was burnt to death in a backyard fire in March 1837. Elizabeth was born 1836. The Perth Gazette 1833 reported that William Barnard assaulted a constable and was fined. In 1838 and 1839 he was involved three times in litigation (occupation then a labourer). Seven more children were born to them, the last three at York, where they moved in 1848. William worked as a farm labourer and sandalwood cutter. His will of 1874 stated former occupation as a 'splitter'. One of their daughters, Ann Maria married Terence McGrath 24 June 1857.

Frances and Richard were married on 16 September 1831. Richard was indentured to the Hentys. He was then employed by Charles McFaul. He then leased Camfields farm and Inns at Burswood. He was also a farmer at Clayton, Guildford 1844-1851. In 1857 was at Deans Farm, Northam. The 1859 Census lists him at Salt River. He employed 6 ticket-of-leave labourers from 1859-1868. He was an illiterate Protestant. Richard died in 1868 aged 70 years and is buried in Northam Cemetery and Frances who died in 1870 aged 71 years is buried at Guildford. Their daughter Eliza married John Thomas Smith son of Richard and Mary.

### **Biography**

After his arrival at the Swan River Colony on the Marquis of Anglesea on 23 August 1829 at the age of 30, Edward Barrett-Lennard was permitted to select land along the Swan River at Guildford. He did so in October 1829, naming this 'St Leonards'. He also obtained a grant of land at Beverley. In December 1829 he was appointed as a JP for the Guildford district. In 1836 he returned to England during which he married Elizabeth Graham on 28 September 1837. Their first child Thomas Graham was born prior to their return to Perth in 1840. They went on to have six more children.

Elizabeth returned to England in 1854 with William and the girls and she did not return. Amelia died at the age of 6, Robert died at 15 from a riding accident and William at 21 from illness. Fanny and Rosa married in England and had families but of the siblings, only Edward Graham Barrett-Lennard survived in the Colony to have children there. In May 1840 Edward P Barrett-Lennard was appointed to the Colony's Legislative Council, though he resigned the following year, apparently due to disagreements over the Government's land policies. In November 1841 a disastrous fire destroyed the 'St Leonards' homestead and Edward suffered a huge financial loss as a result. At his peak Edward P Barrett-Lennard had control of more than 16,000 acres of freehold land. However by 1866 he had become bankrupt. He was generously assisted at this point by his son's father-in-law. James Wall Hardey.

Edward P. was never to regain ownership or control of any of his former properties, though he was able to remain on St Leonards, now the property of his son, Edward Graham and his wife Mary Ann (nee Hardey). Edward Pomeroy Barrett-Lennard died at age 79 years on 29 June 1878. He was buried at the old Guildford Cemetery, now adjacent to rear of the Chapel at Guildford Grammar School. ## Biography

Edward Barron, Colour Sergeant of the 63rd Regiment with his wife Jane and 3 children arrived per HMS 'Sulphur' on 8 June 1829. According to family story Jane was so pregnant with her 4th child that she had to be lowered over the side of the Sulphur in a basket. However, there is no official documentation to prove the birth of Edward George on this date.

The following advertisement appeared in the 1833 Perth Gazette Western Australian Journal. 'Jane Barron respectfully intimates that having renewed her licence she has opened her house at No 1 Murray Street, as the Wheat Sheaf Tavern, whereby assiduous attention to the comfort of her guests and the quality of her liquors she hopes for continuance of the patronage with which she has been hitherto favoured. JB continues her bakery having made arrangements for a regular supply of flour she has commenced baking and will at all times make it her study to supply her customers with the best bread on the most reasonable terms.'

In 1834 Sergeant Barron was riding with Private Nesbit along the Murray River when they were attacked by aborigines. Edward was speared twice and survived. Private Nesbitt was killed. This incident was one of several which may have led to the 'Battle of Pinjarra'. They raised 11 children in the colony, with four of their sons becoming Police Officers.

Edward Barron died on 23 January 1863 and was buried in the East Perth Cemeteries. Jane Barron died 23 February 1878 at Perth and was also buried in the East Perth Cemeteries.

## Biography

William married in 1828 to Lucy Braithing. He left from a Sussex port on the ship 'Caroline', with his wife Lucy aged 18 and their baby son William, who died at sea and was buried off Rio. This was the only death on the voyage out. They subsequently raised six children. In 1837 William was working at 'Strelley' for Harris who was a surgeon and agriculturist. William was given a grant of land north of Guildford, where he farmed the land, built a house and raised a family. In 1841 William was working for a Mr Moore at Oakover, running his horse mill. In 1847 he was probably working for Joshua Gregory.

In 1849 he was admitted to the Colonial Hospital with a broken thigh. His employer, William Brockman was reprimanded for lack of attention given to William. He was away when Lucy became ill. Realising that she did not have long to live she appealed to the Viveash family for help.

They cared for her and Harriet, and Sarah went to live with the Gull family in Guildford. It was here that Sarah was burned to death when her crinoline caught fire. She was buried in the old cemetery in now the Guildford Grammar school grounds. Lucy died on 1 June 1859 and was buried in St Mary's Cemetery, Middle Swan - cause of death tuberculosis.

William Bashford wandered into the bush at Dandaragan in 1865 and no trace of him was ever found. He was in the employ of Mr Brockman as a hut-keeper at a sheep station and was aged 70 years.

## Biography

John Bateman was born about 1789 in London. His first wife died in 1816 and he then married Elizabeth Sherrif with whom he had 4 children. Elizabeth was born 1817, Henry born 1818, Mary Ann 1819 and Maria 1820. His second wife died in 1821. In 1824 he married for a third time to Mary Ann Benningfield with whom he had John, Walter and Charles. Early in 1830 John, Mary Ann and their surviving children Elizabeth, Maria, John, Walter and Charles left England for the Swan River on the ship 'Medina' . A child was born at the Cape of Good Hope and Charles died before they arrived on 6th July 1830. More children were born in Fremantle.

In 1831 he was granted 5 allotments in Fremantle and 4600 acres in Beverley based on the capital he brought. He first built a brick 2 storey public house and store. In March 1833, he was appointed Deputy Postmaster of Fremantle. He was also a Schoolmaster, Clerk of the Bench of Magistrates, acting Clerk of the Peace, Bailiff of the Civil Court and Assistant Harbour Master. He found it difficult to support his family finding it necessary to hold many offices. He was quoted as saying 'business has been so bad lately that for days together we do not take one shilling a day'.

In July 1834 he was appointed 'Examiner of Weights and Measures'. In 1837 he was Secretary of the Fremantle Whaling Company. He was a member of Town Trust from its foundation in 1848. He held the position of Postmaster until March 1855 and died a month later.

He is best known as father of the founder of J & W Bateman, merchants. His sons carried on his business that still exists to this day. Mary Ann Bateman also contributed to the life in the Colony. In 1836 she was appointed school mistress and held it for 2 years. Following the death of her husband John in 1855 she was appointed Post Mistress and held the position until December 1856 when her son Walter assumed the office of Postmaster. She returned to England in 1858. A letter to her son John in October 1858, from the home of her stepdaughter Maria, reflects on the disappointment she now felt on their decision in 1830 to settle at Swan River.

Mary Ann died in 1866 in Hamburg, Germany at the home of her daughter Eliza.

## Biography

Like all the early settlers in the Swan River Colony the Beacham family faced adversity. William had married Mary Scott on the 29 July 1818 at Torrington, West Sussex. William and Mary Ann arrived from Barnham, Sussex on the 'Lotus' in October 1829 after about 5 months at sea with five children aged from 11 years to 1 year. Unfortunately William's wife Mary Ann died at Clarence on 25 January 1830 aged 33 years and their youngest daughter Elizabeth died on 10 May 1830 aged 1 and a half years.

By mid 1830 Governor Stirling released William from his indentures as Colonel Latour's attempts to establish a farming scheme had failed. Such release allowed William to find alternative work in the young colony. William never remarried; his daughter Jane ran his house until her marriage in 1836. William and his children were living in Guildford prior to 1832. Tragedy struck on the 3 February 1832, when Reuben, William's eldest son was speared to death by aborigines at Greenmount, aged 11 years. He was accompanying John Chipper to York with a cart of flour. Chipper though wounded leapt from a large rock to safety and ran to Governor Stirling's farm at Woodbridge, a distance of some seven miles to alert everyone to the tragedy. Hence the name Chipper's Leap. Reuben's father William and a party of settlers found the boy's body the next day with many spear wounds and his skull clubbed in. A temporary grave was made at the bottom of Greenmount as the ground was too stony at the murder site.

Around 1834 William acquired a block of land in Perth. James and Levi are listed as attending Perth School in 1834 aged 11 and 8 years respectively. First born Jane married George Green at Mongers Lake on 21 February 1836. Jane went on to bear 11 children who reached adulthood. She passed away on the 11 October 1910 aged 92 years. A long time for those hard times. By 1836 William was employed as a farm servant and stock agent for Charles Browne at Jim Jam on the Murray River. In 1841 William and his son-in-law George Green purchased Jim Jam for six hundred pounds. Later William bought George's share. William (farmer) James (cattle keeper) and Levi (11 years old) are included on the Murray 1837 census. Sons James and Levi also helped operate a small boat and collected Guanot to try on their crops but with little success.

Levi married and left in 1853. Levi was master of the vessel 'Gold Digger' which could have foundered in the Great Australian Bight. No further data has been found on this ship. Aboard were Levi's bride Matilda and his nephew Reuben Green. This is still a mystery. Son James stayed on with William and married Elizabeth Thorpe in 1862. The farm was passed down through the family till the mid to late 1950's. William stayed on the farm until his death on the 28 December 1875.

## Biography

Robert James Brockman arrived in the Swan River Colony on 28 December 1831 aboard the Egyptian. He married Elizabeth Elliot Walcott the daughter of Captain James Walcott on 12 April 1837 at Guildford and produced 11 children with Edward William (Ned) Brockman being the eldest. Robert Brockman was the younger brother of William Locke Brockman who had arrived earlier in the Colony in 1829.

Like his elder brother William, Robert Brockman also became a successful farmer and grazier and established the property of 'Seabrook' at Northam after initially trying his hand as a contract cutter of sandalwood. Some of his sons became quite famous in their own right. His son Charles Samuel discovered and named the Lyndon and Minilya Rivers and established Manyila, Boolathana and Boolathagara stations. At the time, he was the single biggest landowner in Western Australia, owning approx 1.6 million acres.

Another son George Julius Brockman, became a renowned explorer and was one of the first settlers to establish the Kimberley region which would be found suitable for raising cattle. Julius was also one of the early Broome pearl fishermen.

Another son, John Brockman, was an inspector of Pearl Fisheries at Shark Bay and later accepted the post of Government Resident in Broome. Many geographical features in Western Australia were named after the Brockman brothers or their immediate descendants.

The Perth suburb 'Beechboro' for example, was the name of the Drake-Brockman and Brockman family estate in Kent from which the brothers emigrated. This estate is within close proximity of the towns of Cheriton and Newington near Folkestone, in the south east of England.

The Brockman and Drake-Brockman name has become synonymous with the history of Western Australia and has been associated with many of the major developments and achievements of this State. Descendants have been prominent in exploration, politics, the judiciary, and the military, as well as in commerce.

Robert died in 1897 aged 86 years and Elizabeth died in 1904 aged 87 years.
